Appendix B: Team Paper Rubric

Instructions:

What are we looking for?

- Critical thinking and knowledge application.
- Evidence that you've created aspects of care coordination that your group's patient.
- This means it's <u>not</u> an example of best practices that would apply to anyone with these problems. It's the best care plan for <u>your</u> patient.

What is it?

A written submission that details a care plan for the patient of your choice. This care plan <u>must</u> include an interprofessional and patient team approach, be founded on verified best practices, and show how it was tailored for this patient.

Paper maximum: three to five pages, double-spaced, not including title page or references.

PAPER FORMAT

<u>Title page:</u> group number, student names, course, date, patient short description. Include the honor code statement. (Title page does not count toward page limit.)

Body of the paper (use headings) See the rubric for details on these sections.

- Description and setting
- Health overview
- Care Coordination plan
- Evaluation
- Issue to address

References (does not count toward page limit):

Minimum of two scholarly sources as evidence cited for your care plan (peer-reviewed journal or professional publication) and no older than six years. Web sites and consumer sources may be additional, but not in place of scholarly sources.

Appendix (does not count toward the page limit)

This applies to your **in-class team**, not the team that you discussed in the paper. This should be an easy way to gain 15 points for your paper – <u>please don't forget to include this section</u>, and make sure you have all elements.
