## Appendix C

## Team meeting roleplay

### Instructions

This will be a 10-minute demonstration of a team meeting to discuss an issue from the patient care plan that requires resolution by an interprofessional team. This issue does not need to be specifically addressed in the care plan.

### The issue:

- This should require input by the whole team; not something simple like finding transportation to the appointments.
- Examples:
  - A medication issue an essential medication is causing side effects. Address the side effects with dietary or lifestyle changes, or a change to a less-effective med, etc.?
  - A social issue housing or neighborhood problems that impact care delivery or the effectiveness of the treatment.
  - One aspect of a medication adherence issue.
  - Herbal or home remedies that interfere with the treatment plan but are important to the patient.
- The patient should be a central part of resolving the issue, with their ideas and input considered as part of the decision-making process.

The team members should include the patient, the RN Care Coordinator, and 1-2 additional members from the full care team, depending on the issue. (Dietary, social, provider, therapy, etc.)

#### Elements:

- RN Care Coordinator: introduce the team members and give a <u>brief</u> description of the patient's issue. (1-2 minutes) Team members should be appropriate to the issue being discussed.
- In the context of the overall care plan, explain the issue that needs resolution. (2-3 minutes)
- Each team member briefly suggests how they can contribute to the solution. (4-5 minutes)
- RN Coordinator summarizes the plan to address this issue. If the issue cannot be completely
  resolved, the RN will describe the next steps.
